

UNIFORM

Uniform is purchased from the College Uniform Shop on School grounds.

IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO WEAR THE CORRECT UNIFORM you must bring a note in your diary signed by your parent/guardian explaining the situation and giving an indication of when it will be rectified.

Take your diary to your Homeroom Teacher who will sign it and issue a uniform slip.

Tattoos are not acceptable at McCarthy if a student has a tattoo it must be hidden from view or covered.

SENIOR BOYS UNIFORM - YEARS 10, 11 and 12 - MAIN SCHOOL

Summer Uniform Terms 1 and 4

SHIRT	White short-sleeved shirt, open neck with McCarthy crest. The shirt may be worn out in summer. If a tie is worn in summer the shirt is to be tucked into the trousers.
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TROUSERS	Grey long school trousers purchased from the Uniform Shop. Compulsory black belt to be worn.
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Winter Uniform Terms 2 and 3

SHIRT	White short-sleeved shirt, open neck with McCarthy crest, tucked in and School Tie to be worn.
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TROUSERS	Grey long school trousers purchased from the Uniform Shop. Compulsory black belt to be worn with a simple and plain belt buckle.
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JUMPER	Navy blue V-neck school jumper with crest. (Optional)
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BLAZER	The school blazer is compulsory for ALL students.
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SCARF	College navy blue scarf only - purchased from the Uniform Shop.
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SCHOOL TIE	Must be worn with the winter uniform and for all formal occasions. Tie must be worn with the knot at the collar.
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The following uniform regulations apply to both the Summer and Winter Uniform

SHOES	Black hard leather, enclosed lace-up and polished. No boots or joggers.
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SOCKS	Grey socks purchased from the Uniform Shop. (No stripes or logos). At least 5cm above ankle.
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YR 11 & 12 HAIR	Hair must be neat and tidy. Practical subjects (e.g. TAS, Science) require all hair to be tied up.
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JEWELLERY	One gold or silver chain may be worn. Boys may wear two small studs, sleepers or hoops in the ear (silver, gold and jewels are permitted). Ear studs should be no bigger than 4mm in diameter. Sleepers or hoops no larger than a five cent piece in diameter. No other facial piercings are allowed, and are not to be worn during any school based activities e.g. excursions, retreats, sport carnivals, mufti days etc.
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SCHOOL BAG	School bags with Crest are compulsory for ALL Students. Purchased through Uniform Shop.
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SENIOR GIRLS UNIFORM - YEARS 10, 11 AND 12 - MAIN SCHOOL

Summer Uniform Terms 1 and 4

SKIRT	McCarthy senior pattern school skirt must be at least knee length or longer.
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BLOUSE	McCarthy white senior short-sleeved blouse with McCarthy crest and pattern trim.
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SOCKS	Plain short white socks must be above the ankle. Ankle socks are not allowed. (No stripes or logos). At least 5cm above ankle.
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Winter Uniform Terms 2 and 3

SKIRT	McCarthy senior pattern school skirt must be at least knee length or longer.
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BLOUSE	McCarthy white senior short-sleeved blouse with McCarthy crest and pattern trim.
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STOCKINGS	Dark navy opaque stockings. Purchased through the Uniform Shop. (70 Denier)
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SCARF	College navy blue scarf only - purchased from the Uniform Shop.
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JUMPER	Navy blue V-neck school jumper with crest. (Optional)
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BLAZER	The school blazer is compulsory for ALL students.
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The following uniform regulations apply to both the Summer and Winter Uniform

SHOES	Black hard leather flat heeled school shoes, enclosed lace-up and polished. No boots, no joggers or soft ballet style.
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YR 11 & 12 HAIR	Hair must be neat and tidy. Subtle colour variation only. Practical subjects (e.g. TAS, Science) require all hair to be tied up.
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JEWELLERY	One gold or silver chain may be worn. Girls may wear two small studs, sleepers or hoops in the ear (silver, gold and jewels permitted). Ear studs should be no bigger than 4mm in diameter. Sleepers or hoops no larger than a five cent piece in diameter. No other facial piercings are allowed, and are not to be worn during any school based activities e.g. excursions, retreats, sport carnivals, mufti days etc.
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SCHOOL BAG	School bags with Crest are compulsory for ALL Students. Purchased through Uniform Shop.
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NB. Faces must be clean shaven, beards and moustaches are not permitted for students in Years 7-10. Years 11 & 12 are to keep facial hair groomed neatly. Year 10 is to follow the hair rules of Years 7-9.

JUNIOR UNIFORM

JUNIOR BOYS UNIFORM YEARS 7 – 9

Summer Uniform Terms 1 and 4

SHIRT	Blue short-sleeved shirt, open neck with McCarthy crest. The shirt maybe worn out in summer. If a tie is worn in summer the shirt is to be tucked into the trousers.
TROUSERS	McCarthy Navy blue long school trousers purchased from the Uniform Shop. Compulsory black belt to be worn.
McCARTHY DRESS SHORTS	McCarthy Navy blue dress shorts (Optional) purchased from the Uniform Shop. To be worn with regulation navy socks. Anklet socks are not allowed. The dress shorts are optional to wear. They are not a compulsory item of the junior boys uniform

Winter Uniform Terms 2 and 3

SHIRT	Blue short-sleeved shirt, open neck with McCarthy crest, tucked in and School Tie to be worn.
TROUSERS	Navy blue long school trousers purchased from the Uniform Shop. Compulsory black belt to be worn. No shorts to be worn in winter.
JUMPER	Navy blue V-neck school jumper with crest. (Optional)
BLAZER	The school blazer is compulsory for ALL students.
SCARF	College navy blue scarf only - purchased from the Uniform Shop.
SCHOOL TIE	Must be worn with the winter uniform and for all formal occasions. Tie must be worn with the knot at the collar.

The following uniform regulations apply to both the Summer and Winter Uniform

SHOES	Black hard leather, enclosed lace-up and polished. No boots or joggers.
SOCKS	Navy socks purchased from the Uniform Shop. (No stripes or logos). At least 5cm above ankle.
YR 7-10 HAIR	Hair must be neat and tidy. Hair longer than collar must be tied up at all times. Boys must be clean shaven at all times.
SCHOOL BAG	School bags with Crest are compulsory for ALL Students. Purchased through Uniform Shop.

JUNIOR GIRLS UNIFORM YEARS 7 – 9

Summer Uniform Terms 1 and 4

SKIRT	McCarthy junior school skirt must be at least knee length or longer.
BLOUSE	White junior short-sleeved blouse with Peter-Pan collar and McCarthy Crest must be worn.
SOCKS	Plain short white socks must be above the ankle. Anklet socks are not allowed.

Winter Uniform Terms 2 and 3

SKIRT	McCarthy junior school skirt must be at least knee length or longer.
BLOUSE	White junior blouse with Peter-Pan collar and McCarthy Crest must be worn.
STOCKINGS	Dark navy opaque stockings. Purchased through the Uniform Shop. (Denier 70).
SCARF	College navy blue scarf only - purchased from the Uniform Shop.
JUMPER	Navy blue V-neck school jumper with crest. (Optional)
BLAZER	The school blazer is compulsory for ALL students.

The following uniform regulations apply to both the Summer and Winter Uniform

SHOES	Black hard leather flat heeled school shoes, enclosed lace-up and polished. No boots, no joggers or soft ballet style.
YR 7-10 HAIR	Hair must be neat and tidy. Hair that exceeds the collar in length must be tied up at all times. Subtle natural colour variation only.
SCHOOL BAG	School bags with Crest are compulsory for ALL Students. Purchased through Uniform Shop.

SPORTS UNIFORM BOYS AND GIRLS – MAIN SCHOOL - YEARS 7-10 ONLY

TO BE WORN ON THE ALLOCATED SPORT DAY

SPORT POLO	McCarthy polo shirt with crest.
SHORTS	McCarthy navy blue shorts, with crest.
SOCKS	Plain white ankle length sport socks.
TRACKSUIT	McCarthy tracksuit jacket and pants must both be purchased. Compulsory items. In Terms 2 and 3 the tracksuit is compulsory clothing.
SHOES	Must be lace-up sport shoe.

General Uniform Rules

- Full Sports Uniform for junior students Years 7-10 only must be worn on the allocated sport day i.e. shorts and polo shirt with tracksuit jacket and pants. Otherwise full school uniform is expected. No other shirts, shorts or tracksuits or other sport items other than the official McCarthy uniform is be worn.
- Main school senior students are expected to be in full school uniform every day, as they do not participate in sports.
- Hair accessories may be plain navy blue, red or white.
- Students representing the school are expected to wear full school uniform on all occasions.
- The uniform expectations applies to all students travelling to and from school, and whilst in the wider community.

Jewellery Years 7 - 12

Ear: Two pairs of silver, gold, clear plastic stud/sleeper or hoop earrings. Jewel/coloured stones are permitted. Ear studs should be no bigger than 4mm in diameter. Ear sleepers or hoops should not exceed the diameter of a 5 cent piece.

Other Piercings: No other visible facial piercings are allowed and are not to be worn during any school based activities or school day, excursions, retreats, sport representation/activities/carnivals, mufti days etc.

Keeping a hole open will not be acceptable as an excuse. This means that clear studs are not to be worn in nose piercings as these are visible.

- No band-aids are to be used to cover piercings.
- One gold or silver chain may be worn.
- Necklaces with a crucifix or religious symbol attached are allowed.

Tattoos

These are not acceptable in the school environment. If your child does have a tattoo it must be completely covered at all times by their school uniform and/or a flesh coloured stretch tube bandage and not visible at any time.

Failure to follow these procedures will result in student withdrawal from classes to address the issue.

It is expected that

- The full correct uniform is worn each day.
- The blazer will be worn as the outside garment during terms 2 and 3 and all formal occasions. The sports jacket is only worn on sports days with the sport uniform only.
- T-shirts/undershirts of any colour are NOT to be visible under and/or below the blouse or shirt but are encouraged to keep students warm in cooler weather.
- Only the college hat is to be worn and is encouraged as part of our Sunsafe Policy.
- All students are encouraged to wear sunscreen.
- Excessive makeup is not acceptable and makeup should be a 'natural' look.
- Nail polish must be natural in the look (clear or light pink or light brown is acceptable). Nails that are excessive in length may pose a safety risk or inhibit a students ability to participate full in the learning.

Other

All articles of clothing are to be marked with the student's name and any item lost and then found to be handed to student office so it can be returned to the owner and not stolen.

McCarthy Sports Uniform is NOT acceptable for TTC students, even on a Thursday.

- The same whole school rules in regards to hair, jewellery and makeup apply to TTC students. Students involved in hairdressing may be able to negotiate styles and colours as necessary to practice their trade.
- Full school uniform or trade uniform are the only acceptable options in the TTC.

YOU HAVE VALUABLES

Expensive jewellery, personal electronic devices and money may present security problems. Students are responsible for security of their personal belongings at the College. Do not leave items unattended. The College will not be responsible for the loss or damage of such items. All phones or devices should have Find My iPhone, iPad/computer installed to help locate the device. See Student Office immediately for assistance if property is lost.

INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY ACCEPTABLE USE GUIDELINES

McCarthy Catholic College provides a range of Information and Communication Technologies, network infrastructure and Internet services for a range of educational purposes for all members of the school community.

Students are expected to use these resources in a responsible, ethical and legal manner, demonstrating respect for every member of McCarthy Catholic College as well as other Information and Communication Technology providers.

Students are also expected to adhere to the Parent and Student Laptop/iPad Agreement. These agreements are ratified as part of the McCarthy Catholic College enrolment process or when amended. Students are welcome to use their device on our network once the student and their parents/guardians have signed the appropriate agreement.

The use of our network, ICT equipment and online learning communities must be for educational purposes only and consistent with the objectives of our Learning Framework and the Student Management Policy of McCarthy Catholic College. The McCarthy Catholic College community is governed by the ICT guidelines published by the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP).

McCarthy Catholic College has the right to collect devices and inspect files on any device on school grounds. This covers devices that may contain obscene /objectionable material obtained offsite and stored on the student's device.

Students are expected to be aware of copyright, intellectual property and plagiarism guidelines and acknowledge any material from a website that has been reproduced or used. Students are not allowed to reproduce material protected by copyright without permission of the copyright owner.

Students need to adhere to the following points:

- Devices used on the College's and CEDP's Network will be managed using the Air Watch and Microsoft Intune Management applications. These applications only manage the network setting on the connected device. They cannot view in App data, App usage details or delete Apps. These Apps and associated software must remain on the student's device to support a safe and stable connection to the Internet, deployment of educational Apps to devices and locate devices when connected to our network
- Students are required to have their device with them each day to assist them to achieve their educational goals. Their personal CEDP student email needs to be linked on their device and checked daily.
- Students should not share their usernames and passwords.
- School hardware, software and network resources must not be used to download, display, print, save or transmit material that is inappropriate or offensive to others.
- Social Media messaging during class time is not permissible unless authorised for a class activity
- Facebook, snapchat and similar social networking websites are banned and blocked at McCarthy Catholic College.
- Jail Broken mobile devices are not permitted at McCarthy Catholic College.
- Users must respect Apple's App Age Restrictions and only download Apps that are age appropriate.
- Students need to enrol into the appropriate Google Classroom classes once their teacher has provided them with the Class Code and participate in all online activities in a manner that is consistent with the objectives of our Learning Framework and Student Management Policy of McCarthy Catholic College.
- Mobile Phones are permitted for use before and after school and at recess and lunch. If a student uses his/her phone during class time without permission, the teacher will issue a general warning stating that the next phone that is seen must be brought to the front office. In such cases, the phone will be handed to the Office Staff who will keep the phone secured for the day. The student will be able to collect their phone at the end of the school day.

If a student breaches any of the statements above their device could be prevented from accessing the College's WIFI network or banned from school.

Throughout the year some subject areas, as part of the Learning Framework of McCarthy Catholic College are required to create student logins for 3rd party online educational resources. Student's CEDP email addresses, usernames and timetable data could be shared to create access to these additional educational resources. No personal data is shared. For example, but not limited to Jacaranda Digital Textbooks, OnGuard WHS Testing, NelsonNet Bookshelf and Edrolo Educational Resources.
